


DRAGON BOATS RACE

The morning's main attraction on the 5th day of the Championship in Poznan was a Friendship Relay Race in dragon boats. This was held in sunny but windy weather on the "Malta" regatta causeway. Each dragon boat held 10 participants (guests) of the Poznan Championship and 1 drummer – sitting in as the coxswains in each of the 4 boats were professionals from Poznan's "Stomil" sports club. In accordance with Friendship Relay tradition, the composition of the teams was decided by the drawing of lots and so it happened that we saw people from 12 different countries



manning a boat together! The dragon boats covered the course altogether some 29 times and more than 300 participants in the 2015 ISF World Schools Swimming Championship rowed across the lake. An unexpected additional "highlight" of the relay was the capsizing of one of the boats - fortunately, thanks to the rapid intervention of 4 motorboats with lifeguards on hand to ensure the safety of the regatta, all members of this upset were quickly pulled from the water and transported to shore. So, as it turned out, it was well worth bringing a spare set of dry clothes...
